

SELECTION CRITERIA FOR THE BEST PAPER

To be eligible for the election of the best paper of each topic it is essential that the written paper is submitted before the deadline via the website of the Annual Meeting of the Spanish Nuclear Society (SNE):

Papers exposed in poster format:

The best paper among all those presented in a poster format will be selected in the poster session. For this, the scores given by the congress delegates attending this session will be collected. Each attendee is entitled to vote once, through a ballot which will be delivered on-site.

Papers exposed in oral format:

- All presentations received before the deadline will be evaluated by:
 - **Chairman of the technical session** in which the paper is exposed.
 - **Technical Coordinator of the technical session** in which the paper is exposed.
 - **Member of the Technical Committee** responsible for the topic to which the paper is assigned.
- The winning presentation from each topic will be the one with the highest score of all papers presented in this topic, granting a single award whether the topic has one technical session or several.
- In the case of tie score between papers, the decision corresponds to the responsible member of the Technical Committee of the topic.
- Each evaluator will score the papers between 5 and 50 points so that the overall score of the paper is obtained as the sum of the scores given by the three evaluators. Therefore, the maximum score that a paper can get will be 150 points (sum of the maximum scores of the Chairman, Coordinator and responsible member of the Technical Committee of the topic).
- The assessment will be made by scoring from 1 to 10 (no decimals) and according to the following criteria and score rates:
